Georgian architecture at the Ringturm

The Ringturm is the venue for an exhibition featuring spectacular examples of Caucasus architecture at the crossroads of Europe and Asia.

Running until 30 November, the current exhibition in the free Architektur im Ringturm series showcases Georgia's extraordinary architectural landscape. The show links with the spring 2016 exhibition on Tbilisi, but this time looks beyond the Georgian capital.

Focusing on five Georgian cities lying between the Caucasus and the Black Sea – Tbilisi, Gori, Kutaisi, Tskaltubo and Batumi – the exhibition showcases the exceptional richness of 20th century Georgian architecture with examples of Art Nouveau buildings bearing understated, classical Russian influences, architecturally and historically significant buildings constructed during the decades of Soviet rule, as well as striking modern constructions from the early 2000s.

The exhibition was officially opened by Giorgi Tabatadze, envoy of the Georgian Embassy in Vienna, on 10 October. In attendance were numerous guests from Austria and abroad at the invitation of Günter Geyer, Chairman of the Managing Board of Wiener Städtische Versicherungsverein.

The show, titled *Between the Caucasus and Black Sea: Georgia*, runs from 11 October until November 30 at the Ringturm Exhibition Centre (Schottenring 30, 1010 Vienna). Admission is free.
